POSITIVE	NEGATIVE
I am = I'm	I am not = I'm not
you are = you're	you are not = you aren't
he is = he's	he is not = he isn't
she is = she's	she is not = she isn't
it is = it's	it is not = it isn't

- **I am Kevin. Who are you?**
 - I am Julio.

- **Are you Julio?**

- Yes, I am Julio.

- **Are you John?**

- No, I am not John, but Julio.

- **Excuse me, who is he?**

- He is Petr.

- **And she? Who is she?**

- She is Tamara.

- **Is she Tamara?**

- Yes, she is Tamara.

- **Is she Aldona?**

- No, she isn't Aldona, but Tamara.

- **Who am I?**

- You are Kevin.

- **Am I Kevin?**

- Yes, you are Kevin.

- **Am I Sven?**

- No, you aren't Sven, but you're Kevin.

- **Aldona, am I from Poland?**

- Are you from Poland? No, you aren't from Poland, but from Canada.

- **Really? Am I from Canada?**

- Yes, you are from Canada.

- **And where is he from?**

- Who?

- **Oh, sorry. Where is Ingo from?**

- I'm sorry, I don't know.

- **So, ask!**

- Of course. Ingo, where are you from?
